Unknown Date

“By an act of the legislature approved January 10, 1860, a Court of Common Pleas was created to be held at Sturgeon. The jurisdiction of this court extended over portions of Boone, Audrain, Howard and Randolph counties. Its sessions were from two days to a week in length. No criminal cases were ever heard in this court. The court was abolished by the Legislature in 1949, but it had not functioned as a court since 1921.”
